# **LISTENING COMPREHENSION – The global village (1'50 min)**

You are going to hear a recording about a Hungarian town called *Boly* and its attitude towards new technologies.

## Transcript:

Technology may have helped to  $\underline{\text{turn}}$  the world  $\underline{\text{into}}$  a global village, but it's also turning this Hungarian  $\underline{\text{village}}$  into a more  $\underline{\text{close-knit community}}$ . Boly is  $\underline{\text{wired}}$  in both the figurative and literal sense. Most of its 3 800 residents have a very fast connection to the internet – 10 megabits per second – and they don't like to discuss  $\underline{\text{the}}$  way things were before.

- You cannot even <u>compare</u> it <u>with</u> the old system. This one is incredibly faster.

Boly residents are also connected to each other's homes so <u>town's folk</u> can phone each other <u>free of charge</u>. They can also surf the internet on their TVs thanks to <u>a set-top box</u>, which is the local standard. Mayor Josef Harr says the local area network is <u>making a big difference</u> in the way things are done around here.

- There will be a video library. We would also like to operate the channels with <u>delayed-play mode</u>, but there we need to <u>clarify</u> the copyright <u>issues</u>. There are some very interesting ideas about information flow. For example, the health service management here is thinking about how we can allow local doctors to send a message to elderly sick people on their TV screens asking whether they've taken their medicine.

The reason Boly is so <u>far ahead of</u> the <u>technology curve relates to</u> the <u>fabric of the town</u>. It has a very strong German-speaking minority, and when <u>foreign channels</u> first appeared following the fall of communism, <u>a good deal of</u> the population was very <u>keen</u> to access German TV channels. But with a third of households <u>hooking up to</u> broadband via cable, the local internet became as slow as sludge. That's when the zippy fiber-optic option was taken, opening up a world of possibilities.
